MATCH REPORTS 30TH MAY, 2009

OPENS

1sts v St Kevin's 56-29

Last Saturday the **Scotch Firsts** were looking to continue their winning ways against our rivals from the "wrong side" of the track, **St. Kevin's College**. Recently, **St. Kevin's** were able to land former NBL Head Coach and current Melbourne Tigers Assistant Coach Ian Stacker to bolster their basketball program for the 2009 season. **Scotch** were looking to avenge last season's overtime loss to **St. Kevin's** in the re-draw.

St. Kevin's took an early 2-1 lead, but the first two of **Andy Lim's** 7 first half points gave **Scotch** a 3-2 lead and the boys never trailed again. **Scotch** applied their trademark pressure defence and transition game which saw everyone get involved in one aspect or another. *Vice Captain Cameron Lowe* controlled the interior defensively challenging shots and grabbing tough rebounds. Offensively he was able to contribute 5 first half points around the basket. *Nick Wilson* had a solid defensive performance despite being under the weather. **Scotch** got lots of support from the bench with three of the four players scoring in the first half. **Charlie Ralston** led the charge knocking down a three on his first shot attempt and later converting a lay-up in transition for his 5 points. **Hayden Lamont-Stacey** and **Matt Hancock** did all of their damage from beyond the arc, totalling 3 and 4 points respectively for the half. **Scotch** was impressive defensively holding **St. Kevin's** to just 10 points in the first half to lead by 18 points, **28-10**.



In the second half **Scotch** continued to apply pressure on **St. Kevin's** and convert on the offensive end of the floor. **Scotch Captain Ben Allison** came to the party offensively after dominating on the defensive side in the first half contributing 5 second half points. **Charlie Hancock** and **Alex Fejer** stepped up and contributed with tough rebounds and solid defense. The pair also knocked in shots from the perimeter as well, **Hancock's** from just inside the arc and **Fejer's** well outside the arc with a defender challenging. **Nick Wilson** chipped in with 3 points for the half causing major problems for his much smaller defender in the post area. **Hayden Lamont-Stacey** had a very impressive all-around game playing aggressive defense and converting on all three of his three-point attempts. His dead eye shooting complimented the aggressive nature that **Scotch** attacked **St. Kevin's** with dribble penetration and effective ball movement. **Scotch College** would win a lopsided match with class and sportsmanship, **56-29**. The boys will get a well-deserved break next weekend. Thank you to the parents and **Scotch** players who contributed on the scorebench and cheered the boys on to victory.

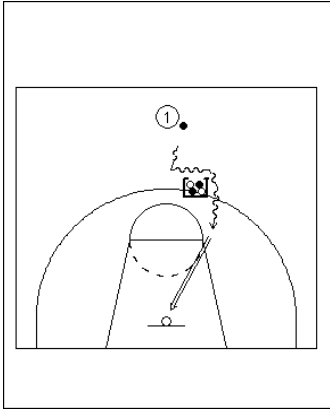

Here are 10 rules to remember when you're on the sidelines at your kid's game!!!

1. **CHEER, don't SNEER!** Only positive words should come out of your mouth during a game. There is simply no place for negative comments or criticism.
2. **WALK before you SQUAWK.** If you feel a sudden urge to yell at the coach or the ref, take a walk and cool off before you say something that will embarrass you - or your child.
3. **A YELL won't make the team JELL.** Don't bellow instructions to your child from the sideline. It's boorish and your kid can't hear a word you're saying anyway.
4. **Don't sell them SHORT, be a SPORT.** If the opposing team has played well, give them a pat on the back. Nothing makes a kid feel more special than when a parent from the opposing team tells him how well he played.
5. **Don't point and BLAME when they lose a GAME.** When your child's team loses, don't blame it on a bad call, a teammate's error or anything else. How will your child learn to accept responsibility if you don't?
6. **Give 'em a SMILE - not BILE.** Kids always respond to the coach or parent who smiles - not to the adult who criticizes or scowls. Besides, your child wants to see you having fun.
7. **RAISE with PRAISE.** That's right, the kids will "raise" their game and their efforts if you praise them. Use any achievement as an excuse for a compliment. They want to believe in themselves. And you can help them.
8. **For Pete's SAKE, give the ref a BREAK!** Remember, most of the refs and umps are volunteers donating their time to your kids. And accept it: "Bad" calls are part of sports.
9. **PARALYSIS by ANALYSIS.** Avoid replaying the game in the family van on the drive home. If your kid brings the game up, fine. But chances are it's about the last thing he wants to talk about.
10. **This I BESEECH, practice what you PREACH.** With too many pro athletes talking trash and misbehaving, parents have to work extra hard to teach kids fair play. Make sure your own sportsmanship is flawless. You are the most important role models kids have!

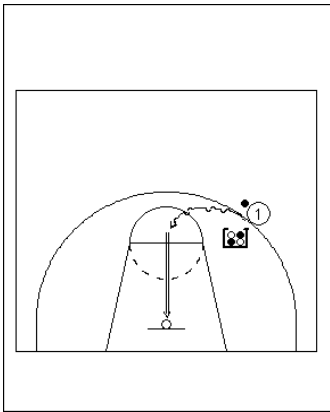

3 Game Shooting



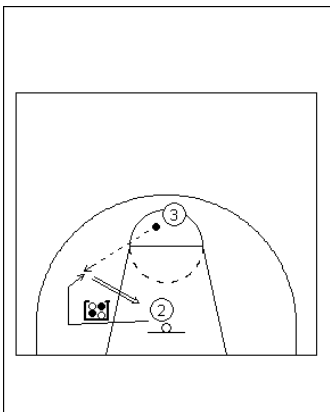
1 Dribble Pull Up - Point

- Start with protection dribble on spot and back down to just outside 3pt line.
- Turn corner hard and pull up for jump shot



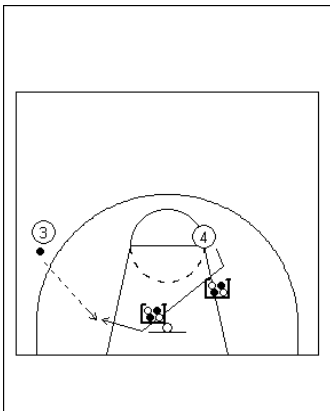
1 Dribble Pull Up - Wing

- Start with protection dribble
- Turn corner hard and pull up for jump shot



Baseline Turn-out

- Start under rim
- Sprint and turn-out for mid range jumper with inside footwork



Double Screen Short Corner

- Start at elbow
- Sprint behind backboard and out to just below block
- Catch and reverse pivot for jump shot
